Why don't you ask me about my learning this week? We have done lots of things that include:

- ★ **English** – wrote a letter as Tostig Godwinson to Harold II, use of apostrophes (particularly in plural possession), analysed an argument text about CCTV cameras, formal and informal language, determiners.
- ★ **Maths** – Decimal place value, complements to 1, addition and subtraction of decimals, reasoning problems involving decimals.
- ★ **History** – The Battle of Stamford Bridge and the Battle of Hastings.
- ★ **PE** – Futsul and Hockey
- ★ **Computing** – How can you tell websites are reliable?
- ★ **Art** – Using view finders to draw in detail.
- ★ **RE** – Jewish beliefs about forgiveness.
- ★ **PHSE** – Holocaust Memorial day assembly. How did people try and help the Jewish people?
