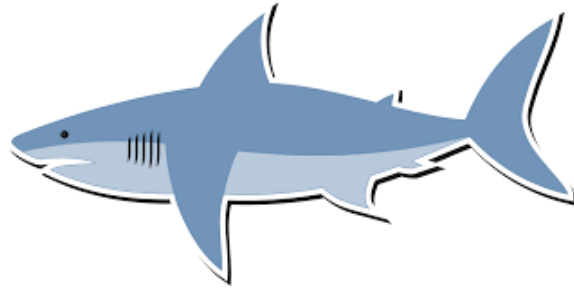


Reception Newsletter.

This week we have been learning about sharks.

The children have found out that sharks are a type of fish, with cold blood and gills. We have seen very small sharks that fit in your hand and enormous sharks that are bigger than our classroom! Most are the size of a human.

We have talked about sharks teeth. They have an average of 5 rows of teeth and whenever one falls out another one grows...unlike us! We have revisited how we take care of *our* teeth and we have reinforced that we must clean our teeth twice a day. We also saw a real shark's jaw, which was amazing. The rows of teeth were so clear to spot.

We have made a collage of a shark, focussing on sharp teeth.

In phonics we have read decodable sentences about a shark, using the sounds that we know. We are getting good at reading more fluently as a class.

We have also read and written words with -ed endings. We know that this makes them in the past and that it can be said 3 ways t (jumped), id (hunted) or d (screeched).

In maths we have been making number sentences, looking at how many legs there are in the sea eg octopus and diver is $8+2$ so here are 10 legs. We have counted on from 5 and made amounts of money up to 10p.
